

Passover is a holiday or festival celebrated primarily by Jewish people. They celebrate it to remember the story of their ancestors' struggle for freedom from slavery in Egypt. Passover is celebrated at home with a special meal called a seder. "Seder" means "order" in Hebrew. The seder helps one to remember the order of events in the Passover story. The traditions and songs that tell the story of Passover are read from a book called a Haggadah. The Passover celebration includes blessings, prayers, songs, and special foods. Passover is celebrated around the time of Easter (March/April).

To create your own Passover Memory Game:

- Color the pairs of images on the cards exactly the same (make sure the images are identical so they will match the game!)
- Glue the colored cards to identical pieces of colored construction paper (only use one color).
- Cut out all the memory cards.
- To play, simply lay all the cards face down. Players take turns turning over two cards to obtain a match.
