

Earth Day Cookies



Servings: 48 cookies
Prep time: 20 minutes

Ingredients:

- 1 egg
- 2/3 cup butter, soft
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 2 tablespoons milk
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 2 cups flour
- green and blue food coloring



Instructions

1. In a large bowl, beat the butter, sugar, salt and baking powder on medium-high speed for about 30 seconds or until fluffy.
2. Add the egg, milk, and vanilla extract and beat just until combined.
3. Add the flour and mix with a wooden spoon until combined.
4. Divide the dough in half and place in two separate bowls. Using a couple of drops of food coloring, dye one half green and the other half blue. Gently knead the dough to mix in the color evenly.
5. Cover and chill the dough for about 20 minutes.
6. To make the cookies: Combine a piece of the green dough and a piece of the blue dough together to form a one-inch ball.
7. Place on ungreased cookie sheet and using the bottom of a glass flatten the ball into a cookie shape.
8. Bake at 350 degrees for about 6-8 minutes or just until set. Do not overbake.



Invent your own cereal box!

Step 2: Associate with an original trademark from the Montreal Canadiens early years

When someone invents a new product or a new cereal recipe, they look for a company that will endorse their product. For your new invention, choose one of the four original logos the Montreal Canadiens used from 1909 to 1917 to associate your cereal with.



Step 3: Creation of the box

Invent the cereal, title and all its components. Draw the front of your cereal box on a blank paper. Once completed, glue it on an empty cereal box that you have at home.

Pay attention to the proportions: The title and drawings should take up a large part of the cereal box.

Material:

- Recycled material or waste collected
- All types of glue (hot glue, white glue, tape, ...)

Gather all the recycled items you collected. Brainstorm ideas of what your trophy could look like using the items collected and then sketch out your idea. Think about painting some of the items before you glue them together to give your trophy a unified look. Let your imagination run wild!
