

Spooky Youppi!

One of Youppil's favorite holidays is Halloween of course! He loves getting dressed up in different

costumes. This year, Youppi! wants his costume to be scary like Dracula, Frankenstein and witches!



Your task is to create a caricature of Youppi! looking


scary. Exaggerate his eyes, mouth and body. You must also create a costume and Halloween decorations surrounding the mascot.

Preparation:

• Look up images of eyes, noses, BOOL ECCCK mouths and eyebrows.



- Find an expression that you would like to give Youppil.
- Practice making different scary expressions on a piece of recycled paper or in a sketch book. Directions:
- Reproduce your scary caricature on Youppil's face in the template. Don't forget to exaggerate his eyes and mouth.
- Next, draw a costume for Youppil and place him in a scary background. The Halloween setting is up to you. Where could he be? What is he doing? Is he holding anything in his hands? Is he inside or outside? Day or night?





Halloween Monster Mouth

Here's a spooky, silly fruit snack. They're easy to make and will make you smile at that fun creation you made with your two hands!

Ingredients:

- 2 green apples
- 1/2 cup creamy peanut butter*
- 2-3 strawberries, sliced
- I-2 candy eyes per apple bite **
- sunflower seeds or mini marshmallows (to make teeth)
- Lemon juice to keep apples from browning

Instructions:

- Remove the core and slice the apples into 8 pieces (an apple slicer works well).
- Dip apples in lemon juice to keep them from turning brown.
- Take two slices and spread peanut butter on one side, using the peanut butter to make them stick together. You can use toothpicks to help if peanut butter won't hold.
- Place 4 sunflower seeds on the top of the "mouth" for the teeth.
- Place one sliced strawberry inside the mouth for the tongue.
- "Glue" each eye above the mouth with a dab of peanut butter to stick.

Store your monster mouths in an air-tight container and they are good to go!

For a nut-free version: replace peanut butter with sunflower butter
Use a split fresh blueberry on top of split mini-marshmallows if you don't have candy eyes.

Halloween Silhouette Painting

Gather your supplies to create your very own Forum Ghost! This Halloween silhouette painting uses a template to create a reverse stencil.

Material:

- Black paper
- White or silver paint
- Ghost templates
- Scrap paper

Instructions:

- Fold the scrap paper in half and cut a semi-circle shape from the center.
- Open out the paper so you have a frame with a circle missing. Lay this on top of the black paper.
- Choose one of the Ghost templates and cut it out (don't forget to cut out the eyes and mouth!).
- Lay the template in the middle of the circle on the black paper.



• With a thick paint brush, dab on white or silver paint - being sure to hold the scrap paper and the template still.

Peel away the scrap paper and template.

Halloween Luminaries

Add some spooky spirit to your Halloween decorating with this fun craft. These glass jar luminaries are easy

to make and can be completely unique with a little imagination. Get set for a frightfully fun Halloween!

Material:

- clean, empty jars
- white acrylic paint
- black acrylic paint
- black Sharpie marker
- tea light candles or other illumination

Instructions:

Step I: Paint the outside of the jars with white acrylic paint. Let dry completely then add a second coat. Let dry, preferably overnight. For something different, you can also consider painting your jars in Flames colors! Or even painting on a cool Flames logo.

Step 2: Use a black Sharpie marker to draw on eyes and mouths, and then fill in with black acrylic paint. Let dry completely.

Step 3: Add glow lights, tea light candles, votive candles or any other illumination. Then display in a window or make a few and line them up along your sidewalk for a fun and spooky entrance.





Monster Mash Toast

Here's a healthy way to start Halloween day or for an after-school snack!

Makes 2 Avocado Toasts

- 2 avocados
- 1/2 Tablespoon lemon juice
- I sheet of seaweed
- radishes
- black olives
- mini dill pickles
- grape tomatoes
- walnuts
- 1/4 red bell pepper
- 2 pieces of toast

Instructions:

- Slice the avocados in half, remove the stone, and scoop out the avocado flesh into a bowl. Add the lemon juice and pinch of salt and pepper, then mash with a fork.
- Prepare the toppings for the facial features of the toast faces. Use scissors to cut out shapes from the seaweed (or use black olives). You'll need circles for eyes, zigzags for hair, and thin strips for smiles, scars, noses, and eyebrows.





• Chop the red bell pepper into small pieces to make lips, fangs, nostrils, and pupils. Slice the radishes for eyeballs. Slice the olives into rings for eyes.


• Spread the mashed avocado onto the toast pieces and decorate. Let your imagination run wild!!
